

Keeping you updated

T is my pleasure to welcome you, our readers, to this publication of the Harry Gwala District Municipality (HGDM).

It is our priority to provide you with information on what is happening in our District and also to keep you informed on service delivery.

I would like to introduce our Public Relations Officer, Miss Nontuthuko Ngubane who has joined us recently. We hope that with her as a new member of the communication team we will continue to provide you with stories of interest, that are newsworthy to both our District's urban and rural areas.

KwaZulu-Natal has recently encountered a very challenging period, with the recent floods in April, which left devastating effects. More than 400 people died, people lost their homes and infrastructure was severely affected.

On the 2nd, 9th to the 12th of April 2022, the Harry Gwala District Municipality experienced heavy rains, thunderstorms accompanied by lightning which resulted in flooding in some areas. The following municipalities were affected, Dr. Nkosazana Dlamini-Zuma, Greater Kokstad, uBuhlebezwe, and UMzimkhulu Local Municipalities.

The Disaster units in Harry Gwala District and Disaster management teams in the above-mentioned local municipalities responded by providing emergency assistance to the families affected.

Houses were flooded, walls collapsed in certain instances, some bridges and roads could not be accessed as a result of the floods. Indeed it has been a difficult time. What compounded this challenging period is the reality that we have not fully recovered from the July 2021 unrest and Covid-19.

On that note, condolences to those families who were affected by the floods. We also applaud the men and women (Police, Nurses, Fire fighters, Traffic Police and others), for their efforts in ensuring that community members are safe during this time.

We have had exciting programmes as the Municipality in the recent past, which include the celebration of Human Right Day in Ixopo at the Peace Initiative Hall, Eastern Seaboard Development Imbizo at Kokstad, Dr Nkosazana Dlamini Zuma Local Municipality's 2022 Local Economic Development, Tourism and Investment Summit at Sani Pass, which was a two-day event. The District Development Model (DDM) event was led by Minister Champion Mr Mondli Gungubele, who is the Minister in the Presidency. The Minister was impressed with the overall performance of the District Municipality and the sister municipalities with regards to the provision of service delivery to the citizens of the district.

Our appreciation is extended to the community of Harry Gwala as a whole for being patient with us during the emergency period when we experienced water supply interruptions due to a combination of factors, with maintenance being the major one. You are kindly reminded to make use of the customer care for any assistance required regarding the supply of water.

In March 2022 we embarked on a customer service roadshow in UMzimkhulu to reach out to the public, particularly consumers who are unable to visit our municipal offices during the week. We will continue to have such roadshows where customers are given the opportunity to raise their utility service-related queries such as application for amnesty, updating of information, registration as indigent, debt payment arrangements, and reporting of water services queries. I do hope you will be informed when reading this issue, we have put together. Please continue to engage us on our social media platforms, the HGDM website and other communication channels.

Long-term vision leaving an incredible mark

The Harry Gwala District leadership is more than capable of taking the Region to new frontiers.... says Minister in the Presidency.

HE Minister in the Presidency, Mondli Gungubele is confident that the Harry Gwala District Municipality is amongst the few municipalities in the country that has a clear mandate and a roadmap to better the lives of the rural communities especially under the current leadership.

Gungubele spoke exclusively after his recent visit to the Harry Gwala District, introductory event Minister Gungubele who is the new political champion of the District. He replaces the Minister in the Presidency, Jackson Mthembu in the role of political champion.

Minister Gungubele stressed that the kind of infrastructural development he has witnessed has made him confident that the current leadership has a clear long-term vision of leaving an indelible mark for future generations to come.

"I just came here to introduce myself to the Mayors within the District and I will henceforth be working directly with them but to my surprise I was greeted with good news that out of the efforts and promises we make through sending messages of hope to the nation, all of that becomes a reality here..., said Gungubele"

He said this is according to infrastructural projects and investments he witnessed in uBuhlebezwe, Greater Kokstad and uMzimkhulu municipalities that would sustain the revenue of these municipalities without having to depend on other spheres of government for grants that have been shrinked due to the economic crisis facing the country.

He said he has no doubt that the mission of the municipality to become a leader in the provision of improved service delivery will be successful.

He added that district's vision the provision of water, tourism and agriculture will be realised.

During his visit, he (Gungubele) was warmly welcomed by the District Mayoral delegation led by the District Mayor Councillor, Zamokwakhe Nxumalo, which included the Mayors from the family of municipalities, as well as officials and relevant stakeholders.

This is part of the District Development Model (DDM) launched by the country's President Cyril Ramaphosa, which is a Direct link to the Regional, Provincial and National Government with the aim of fast-tracking service delivery and finding permanent solutions to priority challenges. It also aims to improve the coherence and impact of government service delivery as a centre of economic development including job creation.

It is further a District-based inter-governmental and

multi-sectoral service delivery approach whose aim is to ensure that there is coherence, consistency and continuity in the relationship between all spheres of government in terms of service delivery.

Minister Gungubele visited the R 600 million construction site of the Bulwer Dam which is currently underway that will supply the whole District and other parts of Musa Dladla and South Coast regions; a construction of more than 350 community residential units in Ixopo and Kokstad for the middle class, the N2 R560 million Kokstad interchange, R 80 million under- construction electricity power station, the Harry Gwala Sports Centre in Umzimkhulu and many more.

The Minister in the Presidency also stated that the COVID-19 pandemic remains a challenge to many countries and South Africa is no different. He said government continues to encourage citizens to vaccinate and to protect themselves against contracting the COVID-19 virus and

ultimately falling ill.

It is for this reason that on the last leg of the two day programme, Minister Gungubele and the District Mayor Nxumalo visited a local church to conduct a vaccination roll-out awareness session. In his address to the congregants, the Minister urged them to vaccinate in order to protect themselves and their loved ones.

"Responding to the service delivery needs of the people of South Africa remains at the core of this government and we will do everything in our ability to ensure that our people receive the services that they deserve", said Gungubele.

Mayor Nxumalo, said this visit was necessary so that they can continuously monitor the service delivery projects that are being implemented in the area as part of the District Development Model (DDM) to see how far they are and how local, provincial and national government can work together to make sure projects get completed on time.



Leadership conducting oversight

GREEN DROP ASSESSMENT OUTCOMES FOR 2021/22

UNICIPALITIES in South Africa face many challenges in providing effective water services to consumers, especially in the management of waste water treatment plants (WWTPs) and Harry Gwala District Municipality is no exception. One of the regulatory approaches that gained significant momentum in South Africa is the incentive-based regulation, which was introduced in September 2008. The concept was defined by two programmes: the Blue Drop Certification Programme for Drinking Water Quality Management Regulation and the Green Drop Certification Programme for Waste water Quality Management Regulation.

The Green Drop process measures and compares the results of the performance of water services authorities and their providers via a standardised scorecard, and subsequently rewards or penalizes the municipality upon evidence of their excellence or failures according to the minimum standards or requirements that have been defined. The Green Drop certification strategy revolves around the identification of mediocre performing municipalities, which consequently corrects identified shortcomings.

While the Green Drop assessment focuses on the entire business of the municipal waste water services, risk analysis focuses specifically on the waste water treatment function. This allows the regulator to have insight into the treatment component of the municipal business, which is one of the high-risk components within the production chain.

Risk-based regulation allows the municipality to identify and prioritise the critical risk areas within its waste water treatment process and to take corrective measures to abate them. Risk analysis is used by the regulator to identify, quantify and manage the corresponding risks according to their potential impact on the water resource and to ensure a prioritised and targeted regulation of high-risk municipalities.

Harry Gwala District Municipality (HGDM) was subjected to the Green Drop Assessment from the 8th to the 10th of September 2021. The first two days were allocated for assessment of all HGDM Waste water Treatment Works on the IRIS system and the third day was for a physical audit. For physical assessment/audit, the assessor nominated Kokstad WWTW. The municipality later received an invite to a virtual Confirmation Session whereby the Assessor confirms all the documentation received during the assessment and documents that were uploaded on IRIS. This session took place on the 19th of November 2021.

Water Services Authority Municipalities and Institutions receive Green Drop status when they achieve scores of 90% or higher, against stringent Green drop assessment requirements. Green Drop scores are given per individual waste water system within the municipal area for the following:

- 1) Process control, maintenance and management skills;
- 2) Waste water quality monitoring;
- 3) Credibility of waste water sampling and analysis;
- 4) Submission of waste water quality results;
- 5) Waste water quality compliance;
- 6) Management of waste water quality failures;
- 7) Storm-water and water demand management;
- 8) By-laws;
- 9) Capacity and facility to reticulate and treat waste water;
- 10) Publication of waste water quality performance;
- 11) Waste water asset management.

The water Services department in the Harry Gwala District Municipality is responsible for water services compliance and monitoring as such it took the lead in coordinating the Water Services Authority audits/assessments. However, all departments within the institution had a unique role to play in ensuring that the outcomes of the assessments are not detrimental to the Water Services Authority status of HGDM.

HGDM has managed to keep the Water Services Authority status by scoring 64% during the 2021 GDS Assessment. These results were announced on Friday the 1st of April 2022 by the Minister of Water and Sanitation, Senzo Mchunu in a virtual gathering. It is important to note that the GDS score has decreased from the previous 2013 score which was 67%. Even though there is a decrease of 3% and still does not have a Green Drop Certificate, HGDM has kept its WSA status and does not have a Directive or Disqualifier, unlike other KZN WSAs and WSIs.

Report on water conservation, health & hygiene, and vandalism

USTOMER Care strives to create a society that is aware of water as a limited and essential resource. As such this division within the Harry Gwala District Municipality has embarked on an ongoing programme aimed at creating awareness of Water conservation, health hygiene, and advocating against water infrastructure vandalism. As the WSA one of the key functions is to educate communities about the importance of health and hygiene, water conservation, and anti vandalism of water infrastructure.

The Customer Care unit conducted awareness campaigns for the communities of Dr. Nkosazana Dlamini-Zuma and uBuhlebezwe Local Municipalities. Customer Care educates the communities of Harry Gwala to take responsibility and own their infrastructure to make sure that they always have water at all times and that the vandalism of the water schemes is curbed. Awareness also includes the processes and procedures that customers and communities should take in reporting burst pipes, damaged taps, and sewer spillages. With the complaints logged into a register with the Customer Care Unit, it becomes easy to plan awareness campaigns for the areas that have got the most complaints in terms of vandalism and water leaks related issues.

Health and Hygiene

Health and hygiene awareness is conducted to promote ways of using sanitation infrastructure correctly, whether its VIP toilets or water borne systems. Health and hygiene awareness is also embarked on to curb the spread of diseases caused by the unhealthy environment, such as dumping waste in undesignated areas. This is a dangerous precedent as when there are floods waste travels and blocks sewer and

water lines. This also leads to pipe bursts and sewer spillages. Communities are taught to refrain from using magazines, and newspapers as wipes when using the toilets and from disposing of sanitary towels, pampers, and any other form of diapers in their toilets. These foreign objects block the sewer lines and they compromise the lifespan of VIP Toilets.

Water Conservation and Vandalism

Communities were educated about the importance of conserving water, as it is a scarce resource. Communities use water daily therefore it should be used sparingly so that it can be saved for future generations. Communities were given tips on how to use water sparingly at household levels. It was emphasized that communities have a responsibility to report water if the service is interrupted or when there a burst pipes and leaking taps. The communities were urged not to vandalize the water infrastructure built for them. Electricity cable theft, solar panel, and static tanks and taps affecting the provision of water services were raised with communities. This is for their benefit as everyone has a responsibility to use water sparingly since our district is amongst those places that do not have enough water.

Vandalism of water infrastructure deprives the community of a constant water supply. Moreover interfering with municipal infrastructure is a criminal offense and as such must be reported. Communities were also educated that water tanker services which is for use by everyone, only limited containers must be used by each family. The communities requested that the awareness programme be taken to schools as most vandalism is done by school children. Communities have been encouraged to use the call center as this makes it easy to follow up on complaints.

Fortunately, in his visit to the Kokstad reservoirs, the Mayor, discovered that major challenges that had befallen the projects were resolved but only minor challenges were outstanding.

The delegation included the deputy Mayor, Cllr. Nosisa Jojozi, Speaker, Cllr. Sibongiseni Mdunge, managers and officials from the District Municipal water section who had to provide answers to some questions posed to them.

The Mayor and the delegation's visit started at the Kokstad Municipal Council Chamber, where they were briefed by the employees of the Harry Gwala District's Kokstad satellite office about the challenges that are a nightmare or require the immediate intervention of the head office.

Besides conducting follow-up monitoring assessment the visit was also part of the Mayor's mandate of ensuring service delivery to the communities on set time-frames.

He visited reservoirs in the Kokstad townships and the Crystal Springs Dam where the Mayor suggested that his Municipality should conduct relevant research in constructing river catchment areas to preserve water that will be used during dry winter seasons.

PROJECT PROFILE: KOKSTAD RISING MAIN

PROJECT NAME

Construction of the Kokstad Rising Main 5km, 500mm diameter Steel and uPVC, 2 x Pumps and Pump House,

PROJECT LOCATION

The project is in the Greater Kokstad Local Municipality which falls within the jurisdiction of the Harry Gwala District Municipality. The project mainly targets water supply in the Kokstad area. The area is mostly commercial, residential and agricultural. This pipe is designed as a rising main from the Kokstad pump station which extracts water from the nearby Mzintlava river.

BACKGROUND

The project will benefit the residents in the Kokstad area of the Greater Kokstad Local Municipality in the Harry Gwala District Municipality. The project mainly targets water supply in the Kokstad area.

The Kokstad area is a mixed-use area between residential, agricultural and tourist attractions with holiday accommodations (hotels, lodges etc). The Kokstad town has been experiencing water shortages due to the infrastructure limitations. This pipe is designed as a rising main from the Kokstad pump station which extracts water from the nearby Mzintlava River. The water is then pumped through an existing pipeline to the Water Treatment Plant (WTP) where it will be treated before it is distributed to the community.

Enroute to the WTP, the pipe will traverse through private land, and underneath the Provincial road R617. The existing WTP is considered to be sufficient for the proposed upgrade; however, the abstraction works, reticulation, reservoirs and source development is also planned to be upgraded on a separate project.

It is further estimated that the project would be completed within a construction period of 12 months.

The municipality seeks to create work opportunities through the employment of local labour under the EPWP guidelines using labour intensive construction techniques where safety measures allow.

The municipality also seeks to empower local emerging businesses through careful subcontracting. Subcontracting will be on packages to be subcontracted to ensure that subcontractors have a clear scope and explicit expectations.

The project is funded by the Municipal Infrastructure Grant through the Project Management Unit under Harry Gwala District Municipality.

CURRENT SCOPE OF WORKS


The current scope of works under this contract seeks to upgrade the existing Rising main from the Abstraction works to the Kokstad Treatment Works.


His political career dates as far back as 1993 when he joined the ruling party after having worked for it underground during difficult times of apartheid.



HARRY GWALA DISTRICT MUNICIPALITY APRIL 2022 FLOODING REPORT

N the 02nd, 9th to 12th of April 2022, Harry Gwala District Municipality experienced heavy rains accompanied by heavy rains, thunderstorms accompanied by lightning which resulted in flooding in some areas. The Following municipalities were affected: Dr. Nkosazana Dlamini-Zuma, Greater Kokstad, Ubuhlebezwe, and Umzimkhulu.

The Harry Gwala District and Local Municipality teams responded to seek and determine the extent of the damages in order to provide emergency assistance to the families affected.

Houses were flooded, walls collapsed in certain instances some bridges and roads could not be assessed due to flooding. **The following areas were affected:**

A total of three hundred and ninetyeight (398) households were affected. Two hundred and Twenty-Two (222) partially damaged households, one forty-three (143) totally destroyed, and one twenty-three (123) homeless. Six hundred and forty-three (643) people were affected. Three (3) fatalities (2 drownings and 1 lightning) were confirmed by SAPS and 2 injuries occurred at Dr. NDZ Municipality.

DISPLACED PERSONS WITHIN THE DISTRICT

As part of preparedness planning, the local municipalities identified community halls that will be utilised to accommodate disaster victims for evacuation when the disaster occurred. Due to the flooding that occurred in Kokstad and Ubuhlebezwe Local Municipality, some people were displaced.

Greater Kokstad Municipality

There were hundred and Forty-two (142) displaced people due to flooding that affected their households. A Community hall was identified and provided with 30 mattresses and 30 blankets. SASSA provided 100 food vouchers to affected

victims.

Ubuhlebezwe Local Municipality

On the 12th of April 2022, four (4) shacks were washed away at Fairview (Shayamoya area). The shacks were built next to the river bank. Two families where shacks were washed away were evacuated to the Fairview Hall and were given blankets and mattresses. SASSA also provided food vouchers to the affected families.

On the 17th of April, nine people were accommodated at Ward 14 Ndwebu Community Hall after their households were totally destroyed as a result of heavy rain and flooding in the area. SASSA also provided soup kitchen and food vouchers to the affected victims. The matter was reported to Harry Gwala District Municipality on the 18th of April.

A total of 190 roads including bridges were affected in all Local Municipalities within the district.



FTER being halted in order to adhere to Covid-19 regulations, which prohibited gatherings, the Harry Gwala District Marathon official re-launch has warmly been embraced within the district with a massive support from relevant stakeholders, businesses, sporting agencies and government departments.

This was evident during the official launch held in Kokstad recently. The support for the marathon was also evident when the venue for the launch was changed at the eleventh hour as it was expected to be held in Ixopo but had to be moved to Kokstad. This did not deter the support for the race as guests and delegates braved the hot weather to be part of this massive event.

The contingent of journalists from across the KwaZulu-Natal province came out in their numbers to witness the long awaited launch, including the Mayors of sister-municipalities within the district and Municipal Managers.

The uBuhlebezwe Mayor, Cllr Bathobile Ngubo, UMzimkhulu Mayor, Cllr Jabulile Msiya, Kokstad Mayor represented by Cllr Zodidi Tshazi, Harry Gwala Deputy Mayor, Cllr Nosisa Jojozi, Deputy Mayor of the NkosazanaDlamini-Zuma Municipality, Cllr Kholeka Hadebe, Harry Gwala Municipal Manager, Nomnandi Dlamini, Harry Gwala Finance Manager, Mthethunzima Mkatu, Social Services and planning development Manager, Thobile Thiyane-Magaqa as well as the Genius Athletic Club director, Themba Gumede were part of the dignitaries present at the launch.

The special programmes manager, Raymond Langa was the Programme's director. The Department of Sport and Recreation in the District which continues to play a pivotal role in the existence of the race was also well represented.

Despite the break owing to Covid-19, the Harry Gwala District Mayor, Cllr Z.D. Nxumalo called for the support of the Marathon set to take place May 15 2022.

He said this forms part of Inter-governmental Relations as it goes parallel with some of the infrastructural programmes of the district as plans are underway to build a R 200 million sports facility in uMzimkhulu suitable for all sporting codes as part of becoming the renowned district in sport.

"Evident to that, we are the rural district that produced prominent athletes who qualified to run in the global marathons here in our country and abroad..." said Cllr Nxumalo.

Adding to that, Cllr Nxumalo revealed that Bongumusa Mthembu, the three-time Comrades Marathon winner is from the district of Harry Gwala in Bulwer.

"Chalwe has also ran in the prominent world's marathons putting our district of Harry Gwala on the map," said Cllr. Nxumalo. He added that it has been scientifically proven that the reason why they have good runners/athletes in his district is because they have clean and non-polluted air.

Getting into the background of the marathon, Cllr Nxumalo said it is a brainchild of the Ixopo Genius Club led by Gumede, which started during his tenure when he was still the Mayor of uBuhlebezwe.

"We have always heard that there was a marathon in the district. We investigated and approached Gumede after which we came up with a clear plan of teaming up to grow the marathon by organising sponsors and other necessities," said Cllr Nxumalo.

However, he revealed there will be no prize of a vehicle as they were still recovering from the gaps caused by the Covid-19.

The marathan is divided into three categorie, the 42.4 kms flagship race, 21.1 kms and 10 kms for both males and females. The race will start at: R612 Highflats and the finish will be at UMzimkhulu College.

The 42.2 km race will start at 06:30 am, followed by the 21.1 km which will start at 7:00am and the 10 km will commence at 07:15 am. Athletes in this marathon will get to share prize monies valued at over R400 000.

In the main race (42.2km) the first man and woman will each walk away with R50 000, second place R30 000, third place R15 000 until position 10 who will receive R3 000.

Prizes for 21.1 km for the first man and woman is R10 000 each, second place R7 000, third place R6 000, until position 10 who will get R1000.

For the race walk for the first man and woman each will pocket R2 000, second place R1000 and third place R800. All finishers will receive medals.

Entry forms are also available at Harry Gwala main offices on 40 Main Street Ixopo, and other Local Municipality offices within the district and on the district's website.

Entry fee for the 42.2 km is R300, 21.1 km is R250, 10 km is R200 and for the 5km Fun Run it is R100. The new race walk 10km entry will be R200. Athletes will be required to obtain temporary licenses for 10km and 21.1km.



MEC Nkonyeni said this was part of their projects to ensure safety for commuters on the road and at taxi ranks as they continue to allocate annual budgets for infrastructural developments in the Province.



Harry Gwala District continues to implement its core mandate for the benefit of communities

ARRY Gwala District Municipality (HGDM) as a Water Services Authority (WSA) has a constitutional mandate of providing access to water and sanitation services to all communities residing within its area of jurisdiction in terms of the Municipal Structures Act (Act No. 117 of 1998).

This constitutional responsibility is carried out by the district taking into cognizance the rights of everyone to sufficient food and water as well as the rights to an environment that is not harmful to their health and wellbeing as enshrined in the Bill of Rights of the Constitution of Republic of South Africa (Act No. 108 of 1996). The legislation enforces the district to provide good quality water that will not threaten the constitutional rights of individuals within its jurisdiction. The provisioning of sanitation services for human dignity is also emphasized.

Sanitation usually refers to public health conditions related to clean drinking water and adequate treatment and disposal of human excreta. Preventing human contact with faeces is part of sanitation, as is handwashing with soap. Lack of proper sanitation causes diseases; reduces the quality and function of life and dignity of human beings. Those in our communities that defecate in the open and in water bodies contribute to polluting the environment, which causes diseases and harms species in water bodies and the natural environment. Poor sanitation has negative effects on individuals, the environment and the nation at large.

In ensuring implementation of water and sanitation as a mandate the government issued the Municipal Infrastructure Grant to be utilized for the construction of VIP toilet units in uBuhlebezwe Municipality and this was based solely on the approved business plan. It is important to note that there is a huge backlog in this municipality and the district at large and as such the money that was received from DWS through WSIG at the end of March 2022 was then allocated towards the provision of VIP toilets in UMzimkhulu, Greater Kokstad, and Dr. Nkosazana Dlamini- Zuma local municipalities. This allocation was guided by an approved DWS Business Plan of WSIG.

Even when no one is watching we need to do right - Mayor Nxumalo

VEN when no one is watching we need to do right, that was the opening remarks by his worship, the Mayor of Harry Gwala District Municipality Cllr. Zamo Nxumalo at the Harry Gwala District Municipality Council strategic planning session held on the 7th-9th January 2022.

Since then there has been 2 other strategic planning sessions, one on the 12th and 13th February which focused on the Budget and another from 16th-18th March which focused on Integrated Development Planning (IDP).

Strategic planning sessions are attended by councillors, the Municipal Manager, senior managers and other officials in the municipality.



Premier honoured to participate in the Harry Gwala Human Rights Day

HE KwaZulu-Natal Premier, Sihle Zikalala conveyed his appreciation at being part of the Human Rights Day celebrations held at the Harry Gwala District, stating that it was one of the districts bearing the rich history of producing a number of political icons that left an indelible mark in the history South Africa.

These political icons, said Zikalala, were recognized both locally and globally because of their unwavering stance in the fight for liberation during the dark days of apartheid.

Premier Zikalala was speaking at the Peace Initiative Hall in iXopo, during the Human Rights celebrations, which marked the 62nd commemoration of the Sharpeville massacre where 69 people lost their lives at the hands of apartheid police.

The Premier urged communities to work together to see to it that women's rights are protected so that there could be an end to gender based violence and femicide.

During the event different MECs from the province were in attendance along with the Harry Gwala District Mayor Cllr. Zamo Nxumalo as well as other Mayors from within the District.

"It is a humbling honour to mark Human Rights Day with the community of Harry Gwala District Municipality and KwaZulu-Natal here in Ixopo," Zikalala said.

He added the 21st of March 1960 marked a turning point in the history of South Africa and was a day where 69 African patriots were brutally massacred, as well as more than 180 protestors who were left injured in Sharpeville.

"Treated as subhuman and a cheap source of labour, their human rights were violated and their lives cut short for demanding to call their souls their own in the land of their birth.

Their crime or sin was to demand the abolition of the diabolic pass system, as well as the evil system of apartheid colonialism itself.

Today we remember heroes and heroines who were

injured and murdered in cold blood for adopting a principled stance against the apartheid legislation that required that every indigenous African male above the age of 16 must carry the dompas, day and night, and to produce it on demand by the police," said Zikalala.

He added: "History recalls that these were peaceful, unarmed civilians who fell so that we as a nation could rise and create a society that is truly united, non-racial, nonsexist, equal, and prosperous.

Our long history of struggle tells us that there are countless others, hundreds of thousands, who fell before them, and many more who followed after Sharpeville and Langa," said Zikalala.

He continued and said: "Compatriots, from the innocent blood that was shed at Sharpeville, Langa, Nyanga, Soweto, Mlazi, Boipatong, Edendale, Shobashobane, at nearby Mahhehle village and many parts of our country, we must renew our commitment to defend the gains of our democracy and that never and never again will the blood of our people be shed in vain.

Human Rights Day must remind us about the sanctity of life and the need to protect life. Let us all live up to the Bill of Rights which protects the right to life," Zikalala said.

"From the ruins of a violent past, the Premier said, South Africans must create a new society that advances peace and justice for all.

"On Human Rights Day, we call on all stakeholders to make a contribution to the call for a creation of a new, model citizen of the province of KwaZulu-Natal. We see such a model citizen as a person who rejects and condemns the use of violence to address disagreements,"said Zikalala.

Mayor Nxumalo, said it was necessary that human rights are protected, he also warned those who infringed on the rights of other people that they will face the law," added the Premier.
