TERMS OF REFERENCE

TERMS OF REFERENCE FOR THE APPOINTMENT OF A SERVICE PROVIDER FOR HANDLING OF ADVERTISEMENT OF VACANCIES, TENDER ADVERTS AND OTHER ARTICLES ON BEHALF OF HARRY GWALA DISTRICT MUNICIPALITY FOR THE PERIOD OF 24 MONTHS.

BACKROUND

The Harry Gwala District Municipality requires the services of an agent to handle advertisement of vacancies, tender adverts and other articles in the print media.

SCOPE OF WORK

- Advertisements/ articles shall consist mainly of bold heading, sub-heading, and text
 in light and bold type faces as well as borders. The provision must also be made for
 submission of final copies before printing.
- 2. It will be expected of the service provider to be able to maintain strong ethical standards in its work and shall liaise with the Municipality.
- 3. The service provider shall at the request of the Municipality, for the duration of the contract, arrange for the placing of vacancy advertisements, tender advertisements and other articles in the media agreed upon with the Municipality. The service provider shall at all times be available to the Municipality.
- 4. Advertising Services
 - Assimilation /assessment of the brief;
 - Create, design, prepare and submit an advertising proposal to the Municipality;
 - Placing an advert on the proposed media;
 - English, Xhosa, Afrikaans and Zulu translation;
 - Transmission of final advertising material to the media;
 - Prepare and submit quotation of advertising cost and expenses for approval by the municipality; and
 - Ensure brand continuity of the Municipality during advertising.

5. The basis of this bid shall be the discount of the media commission to the Advertising Agency (Bidder) shared with the Municipality.

- 4. Bids submitted must be complete in all respects.

CERTIFICATE OF INDEPENDENT BID DETERMINATION

- 1 This Municipal Bidding Document (MBD) must form part of all bids¹ invited.
- Section 4 (1) (b) (iii) of the Competition Act No. 89 of 1998, as amended, prohibits an agreement between, or concerted practice by, firms, or a decision by an association of firms, if it is between parties in a horizontal relationship and if it involves collusive bidding (or bid rigging).² Collusive bidding is a *pe se* prohibition meaning that it cannot be justified under any grounds.
